children. Walking along the canon wall, Mr. Clennan sighted his father's body caught in the rocks about 200 feet from his wrecked sedan, at a point near O'Brien Gulch.

Rescue workers recovered the body and Mayor Stapleton of Denver, who was at the scene, later informed the family of the discovery of the bodies of the elderly Mrs. Clennan and the boy.

Flood Control or Give Up Morrison

It was not known at what point on Bear Creek Mrs. Goodrich's car was carried away by the torrent. Her body was found below Bear Creek High School, below Morrison.

Otis A. Pike, former mayor of Morrison, was one of those who yesterday expressed the view that Morrison must be abandoned to avoid further disaster unless some means can be found to control the flood situation.

"Our first bad flood was July 24, 1896, when 28 lives were lost," he said. "Since then there have been repeated floods. I for one feel we must have adequate flood control or give up Morrison."

"One plan often discussed is to build a dam at the narrows in the creek below the town, and permit a lake to form on the site. The town could be rebuilt in a safer place.

"We thought when we cleaned and walled the gully leading into Bear Creek from Mount Vernon Canon that the problem was solved, but see what happened last night.
